Country Update:

- People continue to be rescued from the rubble.
- The sea port in Port Au Prince could be open in 2-3 days.
- 11,000 US military personnel are in Haiti or arriving today.
- Travel warnings remain in effect urging US Citizens to avoid travel to Haiti.

Labadee:

- Cap Hatien is seeing an increase in the number of people coming into town from Port Au Prince and surrounding areas.
- Security remains strong and no issues have been reported.
- US Marines are in Cap Hatien securing sea port and airport.
- All features are operational for LB call today.

Actions:

- LB is in Labadee today. 60 pallets of water for relief efforts is being offloaded for distribution by Food for the Poor.
- The call centers received approximately 230 calls on Monday (cumulative total of appx 1,000 Haiti related calls).
- The corporate team met at 10:30 am and will meet again at 10:30 am tomorrow morning.

Employee/Crew Concerns:

- Of the 50 crewmembers who were most likely in Haiti at the time of the earthquake, 16 have been contacted and are well.
- HR along with our hiring partner will continue to attempt contact the remaining 34 crewmembers.
- The Care Team continues to provide assistance to shipboard crew.
- Haitian crew members are being allowed and return to Haiti under the compassionate leave policy and are being transported by ship to Labadee.
